or 30 years, the Women's Foundation for a Greater Memphis (WFGM) has been dedicated to advancing the social and economic well-being of women and families in our community.

Through strategic grantmaking, WFGM invests in local nonprofit organizations serving families in five key areas: case management and wraparound services; job skills, employment, and entrepreneurship; early childhood development; youth development and employment; and financial education and asset building.

In the current fiscal year, WFGM is investing \$1.8 million in 38 nonprofit partners delivering life-changing programs across these focus areas. More than \$410,000 of that funding supports youth-focused organizations that are helping the next generation build competence, confidence, and character.

Because when we invest in youth, we invest in the future of our city for generations to come.



BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF GREATER MEMPHIS

At the Technical Training Center, students receive job readiness training and certifications in fields like Culinary Arts, Logistics, STEM, and more.

Last school year, 100% of participants secured employment or college placements, bridging the gap between education and the workforce.



GEE provides hands-on STEM and leadership experiences for girls in underserved communities.

A former participant shared, "GEE helped me discover engineering—and now it's my major!"

- 95% of participants attend college
- > 58% pursue STEM fields
- 28% major in engineering

Girls gain confidence through the Lady Warriors Exposure Program at Booker T. Washington Middle and High School through sports, travel, and college exposure. 98% of graduates transition to post-secondary education, the Armed Forces, or the workforce. Alumni Chrusia W. and LaQuaris H. received scholarships and now serve as teachers and coaches, inspiring the next generation of Lady Warriors.
